Football fever continues to build in Sydney with the FIFA Women's World Cup 2023™ Unity Pitch setting up home at Yulang, Sydney Olympic Park for the next five days.

Coinciding with Female Football Week taking place across NSW, and with only 62 days until the tournament kicks off, the Unity Pitch provides an opportunity to celebrate the FIFA Women's World Cup coming to Sydney.

NSW Premier Chris Minns said fans will have the opportunity to witness the best female footballers from around the world and it will inspire the next generation of Matildas.

"It shows that major sporting events aren't just for elite athletes, they also provide opportunities to grow the grassroots side of the game. I look forward to seeing how communities use the pitch in a way that means the most to them."

Minister for Women, Jodie Harrison was joined by Official Mascot, Tazuni™, Matildas Alumni and grassroots footballers to welcome the Unity Pitch to Sydney Olympic Park.

"With the FIFA Women's World Cup 2023 on the doorstep of Sydney, the Unity Pitch adds another level of anticipation in the lead up to this historic tournament," Minister Harrison said.

"The opening of the Unity Pitch in Sydney comes as our state celebrates Female Football week and I am honoured to be joined by some of the amazing players and people who have contributed to the legacy of women's football across New South Wales. Events like this show how our state continues to lead the way in creating a brighter future for women in sport.

"The thousands of football fans we'll see on the pitch this week is a great precursor to the Trophy Tour in June before the highly anticipated Matildas v Republic of Ireland match at Stadium Australia right here in Sydney Olympic Park." A vibrant multi coloured pitch reflecting the two unique cultures of Australia and Aotearoa New Zealand and the coming together of the 32 nations participating in the tournament, the pitch will be very much at home in the lively and multicultural city.

FIFA Women's World Cup 2023 Australia and New ZealandTM COO (Australia), Jane Fernandez, is delighted the iconic FIFA Women's World Cup Unity Pitch will finish its tour of the host cities in Sydney / Wangal.

"The Unity Pitch was unveiled in Sydney almost a year ago and since then has travelled to all nine host cities, with 1000s of participants from local communities in Australia and New Zealand embracing the opportunity to be part of the FIFA Women's World Cup," she said.



"We cannot wait for its last showing at Sydney Olympic Park, which will also host the most unforgettable FIFA Women's World Cup Final ever."

Whether it's a training session, team building exercise or social kick with friends, the Unity Pitch will bring communities together in anticipation of the world's largest women's sporting event.

Football Australia CEO, James Johnson said the start of Female Football Week was a national initiative to profile women and girls in football across the nation and an important lever to drive gender equity in participation.

"Hosting the FIFA Women's World Cup provides a once in a lifetime opportunity to level the playing field and through the NSW Legacy Fund we are already seeing the legacy coming to life with over 100 community infrastructure and participation grants being funded through phase one of the program," he said.

The Unity Pitch will be in Sydney Olympic Park from 19-23 May, with grassroots football teams and community groups participating in a range of activities. The pitch will also be open to the public for free throughout the week.
